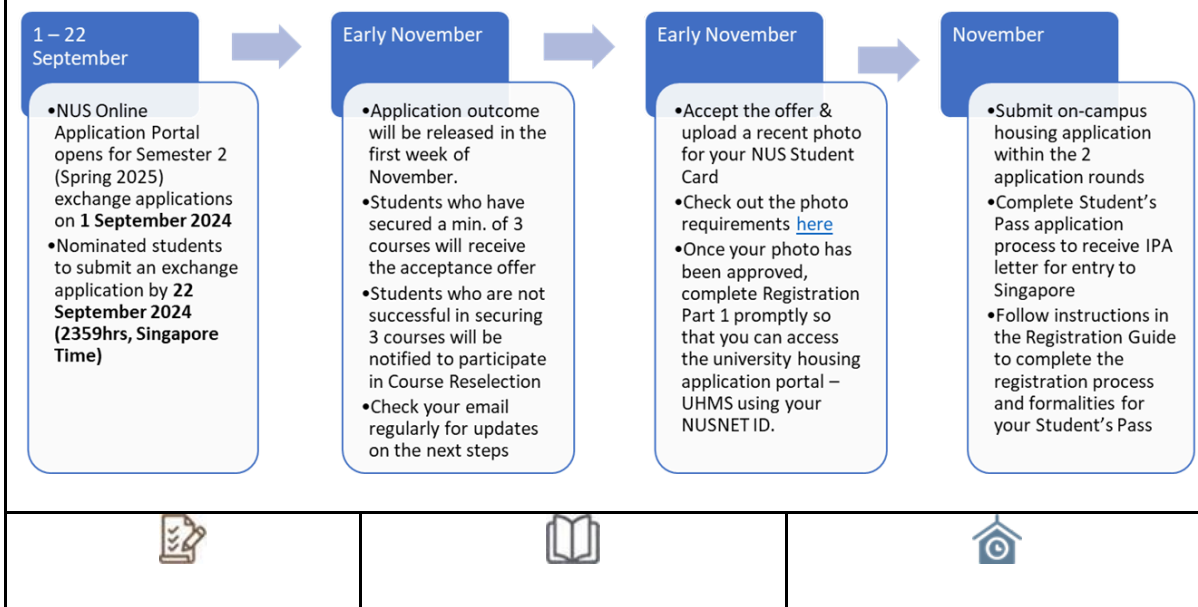




## Information for Students

### Overview of NUS Exchange Application Process NUS Semester 2, January 2025 intake



**Exchange application period:  
1 – 22 September 2024**

NUS Online Application Portal: <https://myapplications.nus.edu.sg/>

After you have been nominated by your home university, you may proceed to submit your exchange application with NUS from 1 to 22 September 2024 (2359 hrs, Singapore Time).

To begin with, **register** a new user account **using your university email address** (instead of your personal email).

Select **"Non-graduating Programme"** and **"Faculty Level"** for your specialisation/level of study in your application.

You need to **prepare 10 courses** for submission with your application. Please read the course selection column for more details.

If you require **on-campus housing**, please **indicate your interest** in your application and your **preferred housing options** – Residential College (with meal plan) or Other Student Residences such as Halls (with meal plan), Houses, UTown Residence or Prince George's Park Residence.

*(Please note that NUS Semester 2, 2025 courses will be updated in end August 2024)*

Please check to ensure that you **meet the pre-requisites** for the courses you apply for. To be considered for higher level courses, you need to upload the syllabi of the courses which you have completed at your home university to the application portal to show that you have met the pre-requisite s.

Undergraduate students should **select courses with course code starting from level 1000 to 4000**. The graduate-level courses starting from 5000 & above are not offered to undergraduate students.

**Business and Law courses** are limited and **only offered to students nominated for Business and Law-specific exchanges**. University-level or other Faculty-level exchange students will not be considered for Business and Law courses. Refer to the [Restriction List](#) for more details.

We are experiencing **high demand** from exchange students for **Architecture and Computer Science courses** which make enrolment into these courses **extremely competitive**.

Please note that course enrolment is **subject to vacancies and student demands**, there's no guaranteed enrolment into any specific courses.

Please ensure to have **more flexibility** in your course selections for your exchange semester. We recommend that you **prepare some back-up courses** in the event of oversubscription or timetable clashes.

**Accommodation**

On-campus accommodation is **limited and not guaranteed**. You can submit your housing application after receiving your NUS admission offer and completing Registration Part 1. It will take some time for you to complete the registration process so please start early so that you can meet the housing application deadlines.

When you login to the university housing application portal (UHMS), please select your preferred room type from the housing options available for your selection. Due to limited availability, you will not view the full list of on-campus housing. If you have any medical conditions which require special accommodations, please upload the relevant information with your housing application.

If you are successful in your housing application, we strongly encourage you to be flexible in the allocated room type and **accept the offer within the acceptance deadline**. Failing which your room will be automatically released by the system to another student on the waiting list. As we are working on a very tight timeline, late applicants or appeals for extension of deadlines will not be considered.

Exchange students should also **seek off-campus accommodation options concurrently** as there is increasing demand from international students in Singapore.

<div data-bbox="375 254 423 300" data-label="Image"> </div> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Immigration &amp; Insurance</b></p> <p>Travellers seeking to enter Singapore should <b>comply with the prevailing Public Health as well as Entry Requirements</b> listed on ICA's <a href="#">website</a> to ensure a smooth journey.</p> <p>With effect from 1 March 2024, <b>COVID-19 vaccination is no longer required for Student's Pass holders</b>. However, students are still encouraged to get vaccinated to protect themselves from severe illness and to minimise risk of transmission.</p> <p>If you have visited any <a href="#">country at risk of Yellow Fever transmission</a> in the six (6) days prior to arrival in Singapore, you are required to <b>produce an International Certificate of Vaccination for Yellow Fever</b>.</p> <p>Exchange students will be covered under the <a href="#">NUS Medical Insurance Scheme</a>. Refer to the coverage for Non-graduating students.</p> <p>Students are strongly encouraged to purchase supplemental travel insurance to ensure they are adequately covered during their time abroad.</p>	<div data-bbox="761 254 812 300" data-label="Image"> </div> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Student's Pass</b></p> <p>All international students <b>must hold a valid Student's Pass (STP)</b> while studying at NUS.</p> <p>The Office of the University Registrar will send STP application instructions to students who have accepted the NUS admission offer around one month before the semester starts.</p> <p>You need to login to the STP application system with the information provided in the email to submit your STP application by preparing the <a href="#">required documents</a>.</p> <p>Monitor the application status regularly as you will be required to upload documents and make payments at different junctures of the application process. Please adhere to all deadlines given as failure to do so will result in your STP application being withdrawn.</p> <p>Once the STP application is approved, you will be issued an In-Principle Approval letter for entry to Singapore. For students from <a href="#">visa-required countries</a>, the IPA letter also serves as a single-entry visa to enter Singapore.</p> <p>Upon arriving in Singapore, you will still need to have the STP issued.
