The course will take students through the illustration process, from concept sketches to finished artwork. Students in this class are encouraged to develop their own unique voice as designers/illustrators by learning in conjunction with other courses, weekly excursions to Seoul, gallery tours, and all other lines of inquiry both inside and outside the school. As a result of successfully completing this course, students will be able to develop a personal style and point of view in their visual journal.
